“French Enlightenment in Australia”

by Emeritus Professor Robert Clancy AM



FASS - the Francophone Association of Southern Sydney, invites you to a presentation (in English) by Professor Robert Clancy, on French Enlightenment in Australia.

Emeritus Professor Clancy AM has had a distinguished career as a clinical immunologist. He served as Foundation Chair of Pathology and Emeritus Professor at the School of Biomedical Sciences and Pharmacy at the University of Newcastle and earlier in his career, was the first Clinical Immunologist at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Sydney. Professor Clancy holds a B.Sc.Med (Hons) and a MB.BS (Hons) from the University of Sydney, and a PhD from Monash University. He is a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians (FRACP) and the Royal College of Pathologists of Australia (FRCPA).

In addition to immunological research and practice, in which he maintains an active role, Professor Clancy has long been involved in historical research, particularly in the areas of medical history and cartographic history. Professor Clancy was awarded an AM in 2005 for service to cartography as a collector of early maps of Australia, and to the field of immunology. He has written two books on the mapping of Australia and Antarctica ("The Mapping of Terra Australis" and "So Came They South"), has served as the International Secretary of IMCoS (International Map Collectors Society), curated several History of Cartography exhibitions and organised international conferences and seminars on the history of antique maps.
